



- Established in 1932 thru an endowment by the late Emperor Showa
- Converted into a quasi-government organization in 1967 and an independent administrative institution in 2003
- Crowing rooster chosen as the official emblem of JSPS








Who is eligible to apply for KAKENHI?

Anyone of any nationality can apply; however, an applicant must be

- & an individual holding a paid/unpaid academic appointment at a Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology-designated research institution located in Japan
- & actually engaged in research activity not as a student at the institution
- & registered and issued an individual researcher number by <u>e-Rad</u>, a government-operated investment in R&D management system thru the institution

JSPS

Features

- & A PI should be a Japan-based researcher and a sole grantee responsible for the conduct of research and administration of project funds.
- & A research group should be organized with 3x as many postdocs and PhD students (early-career researchers) as the PI and its Co-Is.
- & A research period should not be shorter than 7 years. The PI and its Overseas Joint Researchers (OJRs) may not be replaced during the period.
- & OJRs must be employed at overseas research institutions and carry out the project with the corresponding PI.
- Eligible cash from OJRs is not mandatory; however, in-kind contributions (providing space/facilities/equipment) are expected while accepting early-career researchers sent from Japan for 2-3 years.
- & Grant fund may be used to pay travel and accommodation expenses for OJRs or their early-career researchers during their stay in Japan.



 under KAKENHI, which is the largest competitive research grant in Japan.
- & If you are a Japan-based researcher registered in the Japanese governmentoperated R&D management system, you are eligible to apply for KAKENHI.
- E If not but (very) interested in the International Leading Research,
 you could encourage your colleague(s) in Japan to apply for the 5th call
 scheduled for early next year.
- & Even if not interested at all, just keep in mind that JSPS is always here for you.
